- Abstract title should appear in **bold**. Do not indent. The title should be concise and reflect the content of the abstract.
- **Use first initial followed by last name**. Omit degrees. For paper submissions, place an asterisk (\*) after the name of the author presenting the paper. On a separate line, type as succinctly as possible the names of institutions and countries.
- Leave one line blank in between the title/author block and the abstract text. The abstract text should include **background, methods, results, and conclusion**.
- Each abstract may contain up to a **maximum of 1,800 characters**, including title, author's name and affiliations and the abstract text (Spaces are not counted).
- Use italics only when appropriate (e.g. for names of genus and species). Simple table and graphs (nest and in black ink) may be included.
- Abstracts will be published as submitted, i.e. any error appearing in the submitted abstract will appear in the publish abstract book.
- Each abstract must be submitted in electronic form as an **MS Word for Windows** document.

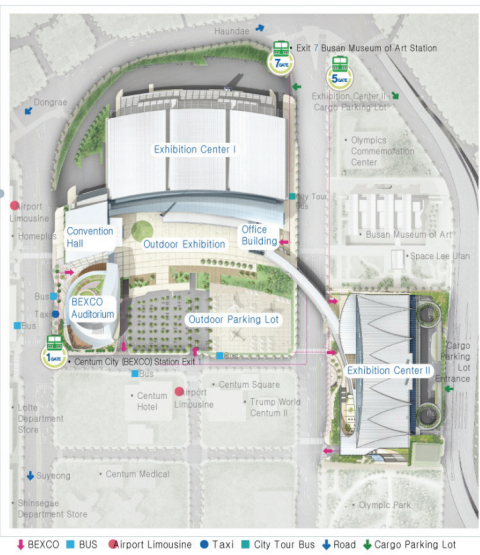

**BEOMEOSA TEMPLE** \_ Beomeosa temple is located at the edge of Mt. Geumjeongsan, a famous mountain in Busan. **CHEONMACHONG TOMB** \_ Large ancient tombs of kings and nobles of the Silla kingdom can be seen around Gyeongju at the Daereungwon tomb complex (Cheonmachong tomb). In an excavation of the area in the 1970s, Cheonmachong was discovered with a painting of a mounted horse. This painting is the only discovered painting from the Silla era. You can also view the inside of Cheonmachong.

**PALGONG MT. CABLE CAR RIDING** \_ Standing almost 1.2km and bordering five different cities and districts of Gyeongsangbuk-do province, Palgong mountain is one of the major mountains in the southern region. Palgong mountain cable car runs a distance of 1.2km from the base of Palgong mountain to an elevation of 800m.



**DONGHWASA TEMPLE** \_ Donghwas temple is located on the south side of Palgong mountain, about 22km northeast of Daegu. It was built by Monk Geukdal in the 15th year of king Soji's reign (reign 493, 21st king during the Silla period). The original name

of the temple was Yugasa, but Simjiwangsa rebuilt the temple under king Heungdeok (reign 826-836) and named it Donghwasa, which means even during the winter season, the paulownia tree still blooms. The present temple was last rebuilt in 1732.



**BANGJJA YUGI MUSEUM** \_ Daegu Bangjja Yugi Museum is Korea's first bronzeware-specialized museum built to preserve the Bangjja Yugi, a traditional cultural property. It also aims to hand down its manufacturing technology to posterity so that the excellence of traditional Korean cultural assets may continue to be presented, and the development of local culture will be promoted. The Museum houses 1,489 items of Yugi in 275 types donated without compensation



**HANJI WORKSHOP** \_ Andong Hanji, located at the entrance to Hahoe village, an area preserving Korean tradition and customs, has done its best to manufacture traditional Korean paper. Andong Korean paper is made of Korean paper mulberry and clean water. Andong Hanji is very proud that it maintains exceptional quality, and the highest production capacity for Korean traditional paper.



**ANDONG HAHOE TRADITIONAL VILLAGE (UNESCO Heritage)** \_ Hahoe village is home to descendants of the Ryu clan of Pungsan and is well-known for its traditional houses. Birthplace of renowned scholars of the Joseon period such as Gyeomam Ryu Un-ryong and Seoae Ryu Seong-ryong, the village became even more famous after Queen Elizabeth of England visited on April 21, 1999.
